14 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the meeting held on 23 November 2021 were confirmed and signed as a correct record.

15 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

None received.

16 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Councillor Forster declared he is the trustee of a local charity with a non-prejudicial interest.

17 CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Chairman announced that the Hackney Carriage trade in Hart district have approached the Shared Licensing team and requested a review of the tariffs they are permitted to charge following the impact to the trade from the COVID 19 pandemic compounded by the current increase in fuel prices and the rises in cost of living.

A consultation is underway with the trade to review the three proposals that have been put forward. Once the majority of the trade have agreed on one proposal it will be brought to Licensing committee for approval. At that point it will be subject to wider consultation.

This item is not being brought to this Committee as it has been given urgent delegation so not to delay the process.

18 DRAFT CHARITY COLLECTION POLICY

Members were asked to consider a draft Shared Licensing Service Charity Collection Policy and to approve it for consultation. There is no change to the detail from the previous Hart policy, apart from the addition of the Code of Conduct for people collecting via direct debits. Attention was drawn to Paragraph 4 of the report which shows as Appendix B and should read as Appendix 1.

Members asked about the impact of collection on credit or debit cards on payment terminals and were advised that the officers would need to confirm that they were categorised as cash for the purpose of this policy. Members agreed for this reason there needs to be clear rules for their use and suggested examples or advice from other authorities may be beneficial and officers confirmed an amendment to cover this will be explored.

DECISION

- 1. The Committee approved the draft Shared Licensing Service Charity Collection Policy for consultation, subject to the amendment as discussed, being agreed by the Head of Place in consultation with the Chair of Licensing Committee and the Portfolio Holder.
- 2. The Committee authorised the Head of Place to make minor administrative amendments to the Policy prior to consultation.

19 APPROVAL FOR ADOPTION OF THE SHARED LICENSING SERVICE STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY FOLLOWING CONSULTATION

Members were updated of the outcome of the public consultation on the draft Statement of Licensing Policy under the Licensing Act 2003. Officers advised only one representation was received and this was from Hampshire Police. From that there is no impact on the Policy or amendments required.

Members questioned if the consultation was a full public consultation or key stakeholders only. Officers confirmed it had been a full public consultation and extended to all responsible authorities. Member questioned if officers were satisfied the consultation was widely publicised enough and a representative range of responses received. Officers confirmed:

- It was emailed to all of the responsible authorities;
- · Was published on the Hart District Council's public website; and
- Had been made available for a period of 12 weeks.

For these reasons Officers were satisfied everyone who wished to comment had done so.

Members questions what would prompt further amendments within the 5 years. Officers explained this would generally be a change to legislation or if local

circumstances changed, for example a lot of licensed premises applied in a short period in a locality. Members clarified location specific issues would therefore come to Committee that Member would discuss and in turn necessitate a review.

Members asked in response from Hampshire Police's consultation comments the report responded in all cases 'the Council is aware' or 'they are covered by the licensing objectives', how does the Council ensure these points are at the forefront, particularly for new or varied licenses? Officers confirmed Police engage with all applicants requesting late night permissions and where they are not satisfied, they would make a representation or look to mediate. As this does not affect all licensed premises Officers do not want to uniformly add.

Members asked in Append B - Delegation of Functions for decision making under the Licensing Act, which states 'if an objection made by Police and not disregarded by the Officers'; why would the Council disregard it? Officers confirmed there was no scenario where the Council would not accept a Police recommendation if there was a relevant offence. It was agreed to amend the wording to remove 'and not disregarded by Officers' and Members agreed this amended version can be taken to full Council.

Members asked with reference to CCTV if there is a minimum specification required regarding quality and usability and effectiveness in dark. Officers confirmed there are, and the Police are permanently adding to the clarify and standards they require. Officers confirmed conditions of areas to be covered can be included and if there is evidence to support a need, can be added by way of a minor variation.

DECISION

The Committee:

- 1. Endorsed the amended Shared Licensing Service Statement of Licensing Policy to be referred to Full Council for adoption. If adopted, it will be valid for a period of 5 years unless it is determined that an earlier review is necessary.
- 2. Recommended to full Council that the Statement of Licensing Policy is adopted.
- 3. Authorised the Head of Place to make minor alterations and typographical corrections to the Policy prior to its consideration by full Council.

The meeting closed at 7.30 pm



Amendment to Licensing Committee Papers

The Licensing Committee scheduled for 7 June 2022 is due to consider a request to increase Hart District Council taxi tariffs. Report papers were initially published on the Council website on 26 May 2022.

The Council was made aware that there was an error in some of the appendices. A formula had been miss applied which meant the calculations showed a falling tariff rate for longer journeys and did not reflect the intended fare increase.

This is corrected with appropriate revisions made to the fare proposal option, and relevant Appendices C, H, I and J.

The original report papers published on the Council website have been amended with the revised appendices published on 27 May 2022.

1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an increase to the Hackney Carriage fares and to approve a proposal for public consultation.

2 OFFICER RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 The Licensing Committee is recommended to:
- 2.2 to approve an increase to the current Hackney Fare table, set out in Annex G to this report, for public consultation.
- 2.3 authorise the Head of Place to make minor administrative amendments to the documents prior to consultation.

3 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The Hackney Carriage trade approached the Shared Licensing Team and requested a review of the tariffs they are permitted to charge, following the impact to the trade from the COVID-19 pandemic compounded by the current increase in fuel prices and living costs.
- 3.2 Section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 provides that a District Council may fix the rates or fares. This can be done in respect of both time and distance as well as all other charges in connection with the hire of a vehicle.
- 3.3 Three different proposals were presented to the Shared Licensing team, these are attached at Appendix B and summarised in paragraph 3.8 below.
- 3.4 An urgent delegation decision was taken to commence a consultation with the trade to review the three proposals that had been put forward. This was to avoid delay the process.
- 3.5 Licensing Committee on the 5 April 2022 was informed that the consultation was underway with the trade to review the three proposals that have been put forward. Once the majority of the trade had responded the options would be brought back to Licensing Committee to approve an option for wider consultation.

- 3.6 An initial consultation started on 31 March 2022 to the 7 April 2022. At this stage only 29% of the industry responded.
- 3.7 In light of this the Shared Licensing Service undertook a further consultation which took place from 8 April 2022 to 21 April 2022. This also included 2 further options. The results are:

3.8 Summary of the options (they are more complicated than this – please see Appendix B) which have focused on the Standard Day Rate:

Proposal A: 1st mile flag, £4.00 for the first 5/10th of the mile, for the following 5/10th of a mile it should be 40p per 10th. That makes the first mile £6.00. After that the mile should be divided into 10 equal segments each segment has a value of 30p which would give a rolling mile of £3.00

Proposal B: Flag of £7.00 which will cover all or part of the first mile. This would be followed by 10 equal segments of £0.32 making a rolling mile £3.20

Proposal C: For the first 1,200 yards £4.00, for each subsequent mile £3.00. That makes the first mile £5.00. This means the rolling mile is £3.00.

Proposal D: An increase of £1.00 be added to the current flag fares.

Proposal E: Happy with the current tariff and do not want a change.

3.6 The additional time allowed for a greater response from the trade with a clear majority responding (57.5% of the trade). Any duplicate votes were removed from the total with all votes from the initial consultation being carried over. (Detailed results in Appendix C).

4 CONSIDERATION

- 4.1 The last tariff increase to Hackney Carriage Vehicle (HCV) fares was approved by this Committee in 2013 and came into force in 2014. The current fare table is attached at Appendix A.
- 4.2 While the trade was consulted on the tariff, the setting of the tariff is the responsibility of the Licensing Authority.

- 4.3 The licensing authority needs to ensure a careful balance between the need for drivers to make a living and the ability of the public to afford to travel safely needs to be met.
- 4.4 If an excessive tariff is set, the trade may look to set their fares below the maximum rate to attract custom. This practice causes confusion for users and creates a situation where people walk the rank seeking out the cheapest fare rather than just taking the vehicle at the head of the rank with all fares being consistent.
- 4.5 There are a number of variables in the cost of running a HC business including fuel, insurance, servicing, repairs and vehicle replacement. These, allied with the variations in annual mileage make it difficult to be precise in arriving at the component costs that could be considered.

The national average price of diesel in 2013 was 141.9p per litre with a local average of 142.3p per litre. The national average price of unleaded in 2013 was 137.5p per litre with a local average of 137.7p per litre.

The UK Average price of diesel in April 2022 (latest figures available at the time of drafting this report) was 175.9 p per litre with a local average of 174.6p per litre. The national average price of unleaded in April 2022 was 162.2p per litre with a local average of 160.4p per litre.

This is an increase of 34.0p for diesel and 24.7p for unleaded nationally and 32.3p for diesel and 32.7p for unleaded locally. (All figures sourced from the AA). At the time of drafting this report fuel prices at local stations are in excess of £1.60 a litre (unleaded) and £1.70 (diesel).

- 4.6 Proposal B received the most votes (59 votes, 25% of the trade / 45% of those who responded) and represents the most expensive proposal.
- 4.7 Proposal B would make Hart the most expensive tariff in the Country not including Heathrow (see Appendix F and G) and is not supported by Officers fearing this would be likely to discourage consumer use and have an overall detrimental impact on taxi trade custom levels. Taxi users are also subject to their own living cost increases and are likely to have less disposable income too.
- 4.8 Appendix H shows an alternative tariff that officers believe provides financial support to the trade, remains competitive with neighbouring districts and is reasonable for taxi users. Using the feedback from the trade the new tariff will be divided into 10ths of a mile as they feel this will make it easier for the public to understand.
- 4.9 A notice of any variation to the table of fares that may be agreed by this Committee will be advertised in a local newspaper. This notice is funded by licence fees and would cost approximately £200. The consultation will also be available on the Council's website for review.
- 4.10 The proposed table of fares will be deposited at the Council offices for a period of 14 days. Any objections received within 14 days of publication of

the notice and not withdrawn will be considered at a future meeting of the Licensing Committee and any variations agreed would come into effect the following day (or as soon as it is reasonably practicable to update vehicle fare meters).

4.11 If there are no objections, the revised fares will become effective as soon as reasonably practicable following the expiry of the 14 days' notice period (as soon as the Shared Licensing team are able to arrange for the taxi meters to be updated).

5 ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

- 5.1 No change to the current fare table. This would not meet the concerns of the hackney carriage trade or address the affordability issues of entering the trade.
- 5.2 The adoption of one of the tariffs proposed by the trade. Depending upon the option chosen this could cause a significant increase in fares that would prove divisive within the trade.
- 5.3 Adopt a different tariff to those outlined with this report. Setting a tariff is a complex and non-trivial exercise. Setting a new tariff or making fundamental changes to a tariff is best done in a less time sensitive arena than a committee hearing.

Review of Hackney Carriage Tariffs - Initial Consultation with the Trade

Hart is committed to balancing the legitimate aims of the taxi trade to maintain profitability in the face of increasing costs, while protecting the public from excessive fares.

Could we therefore please ask you to read the information below and then respond by 5pm on the 7 April 2022 with your prefer proposal (details of those can be found below)

Background

The current tariff scale was agreed in 2013 and came into force in 2014. Since then a number of discussions have taken place with the trade about potential adjustments to these fares

The shared licensing service noted that while the tariffs had recently been discussed, the views of the trade on changes to the fares was mixed with three different proposals now being submitted for review.

Before undertaking the required statutory consultation on any changes, we need to first consult with the trade to establish your preferred proposal on potential changes to the table of fares.

The current scheme comprises three tariffs details of which can be found attached in Appendix A attached to this email.

Proposal A

1st mile flag £4 for the first 5/10th of the mile for the following 5/10th of a mile it should be 40p per 10th. That makes the first mile £6

After that the mile should be divided into 10 equal segments each segment has a value of 30p that would give you a rolling mile of £3

Night rate and Sundays

Flag £5 for the first 5/10th of a mile then the following 5/10th of a mile it should be 50p that makes the first mile night rate £7.50 Every mile after that would be 10 equal segments of a mile at 50p per 10th.

Christmas timings would apply as they do now with Christmas still being double time.

Proposal B

Day Rate

Flag of £7 which will cover all or part of the first mile. This would be followed by 10 equal segments of £0.32 making a rolling mile £3.20

Night Rate

Flag of £7.50 which will cover all or part of the first mile. This would be followed by 10 equal segments of £0.50 making a rolling mile £5.00

The timings for Night rate and Christmas timings would apply as they do now with Christmas still being double time.

It will not be possible to include more than one option on the statutory consultation phase of this process and therefore respondents must select one of the proposal only.

This initial consultation is open for comments from members of the Hart Taxi Trade from the 31 March 2022 to the 7 April 2022.

Once the preferred option of the Taxi Trade has been established, we are required to undertake a further 14 day statutory public consultation to establish the view of residents, businesses and customers. If no objections are received to the statutory consultation the new tariffs would come into operation and with the approval of the licensing committee. If objections are received and not withdrawn an additional Licensing Committee will need to be arranged to consider any objections made during the newspaper advert consultation period.

The outcome of the preferred proposal will be shared after the closing date.



- Option C 17 votes (7% drivers)




